



STUDENT BARGAINING POLICY

Bargaining entails asking for additional marks, retests, remedial assignments, extensions, or any other method of increasing a student's grade without merit.

Examples of bargaining include:

- Using emotional blackmail
- Asking for bias based on nationality or other traits
- Using compassion as an excuse when not merited
- Attempting to circumvent the Academic Office's medical note approval process procedure (by relating medical issues to their instructor rather than the Academic Department)

Students are cautioned that if they are engaging in bargaining, you may be subject to penalties at Hanson College BC's discretion, up to an including dismissal from the College.
